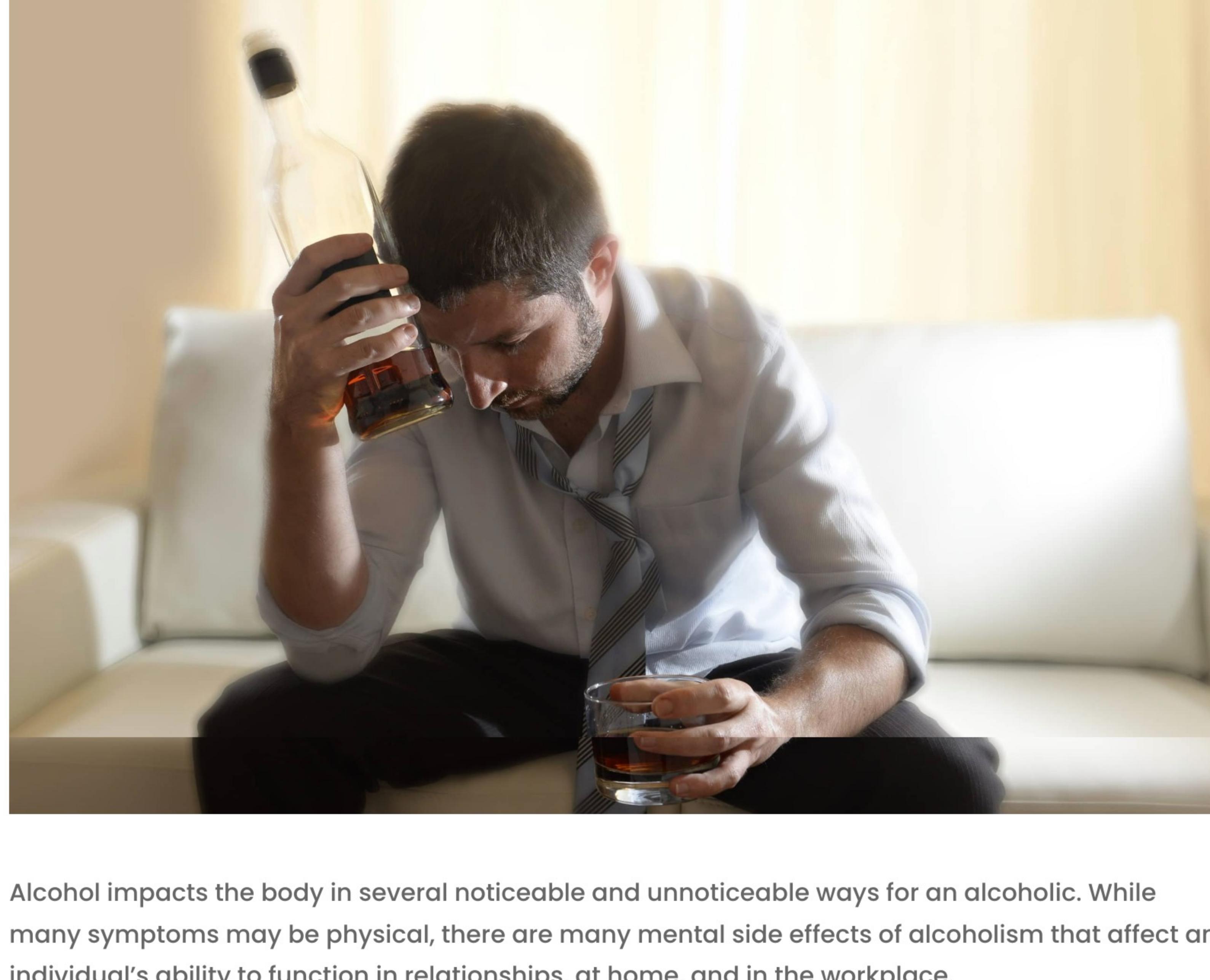


## How Does Alcohol Impact the Body?

### Why is Alcohol Addictive?

Alcohol is addictive because of how it impacts the brain and body. Alcohol works as a depressant and slows down reaction time cognitive responses, and can impair motor skills. As alcohol depresses the system, it can create a more relaxed feeling. Individuals may feel less burdened by social situations and even feel more capable of interacting with others. In combination with the impact that alcohol has on the brain and excessive use, these feelings cause alcohol to be addictive.

### How Does Alcohol Impact the Body?

Alcohol impacts the body in many ways. It can affect it physically, and it can also impact an individual's mental capacity.

Physically the toll alcohol takes on an attic's body can be extreme. "Alcohol misuse is a risk factor for a number of adverse health outcomes, including:

- Unintentional injuries (e.g., motor vehicle accidents, falls)
- Violence (e.g., homicide, suicide)
- Liver disease
- Diseases of the central nervous system (e.g., stroke, dementia)
- Heart disease includes coronary artery disease, atrial fibrillation (i.e., abnormal heart rhythm), high blood pressure, and congestive heart failure.
- Various cancers (e.g., breast, colorectal, and liver)
- Risky sexual behaviors and adverse pregnancy outcomes."

Alcohol also impacts an individual's ability to make decisions, and respond clearly, and increases the likelihood of an individual participating in risky behavior. Alcohol depresses the system extending reaction times and clouding thinking and judgment. This can cause great harm for an individual who is influenced by alcohol and those around them.

### What are the Long-Term Effects of Alcohol?

The long-term effects of alcohol use can permanently damage both the body and the brain.

"Over time, excessive alcohol use can lead to the development of chronic diseases and other serious problems, including:

- High blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, liver disease, and digestive problems.
- Cancer of the breast, mouth, throat, esophagus, voice box, liver, colon, and rectum.
- Weakening of the immune system increases the chances of getting sick.
- Learning and memory problems, including dementia and poor school performance.
- Mental health problems, including depression and anxiety.
- Social problems, including family problems, job-related problems, and unemployment."

Additionally, individuals who abuse alcohol can impact their brain's ability to remember, comprehend, and act with compassion. Alcohol can fundamentally change how the brain processes information and how it reacts to triggering situations. Alcohol use at a young age that continues through adulthood can impact an individual's overall cognitive ability level and processing speed.

### How to Find Alcohol Detox Programs

Alcohol detox programs are readily available across the country. Individuals who are ready to start a recovery journey can access addiction treatment through their insurance or local rehab centers while maintaining their work or home requirements.

Alcohol detox can be completed in a facility or under the medical care of a physician through an outpatient program.

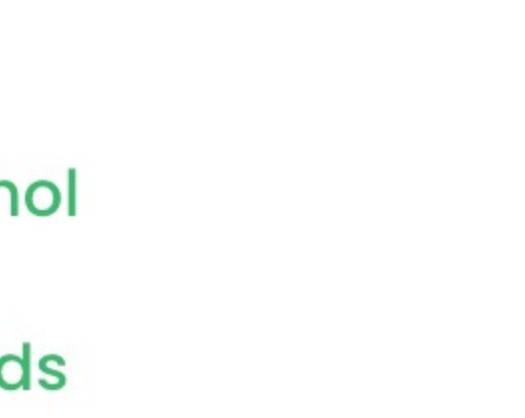
