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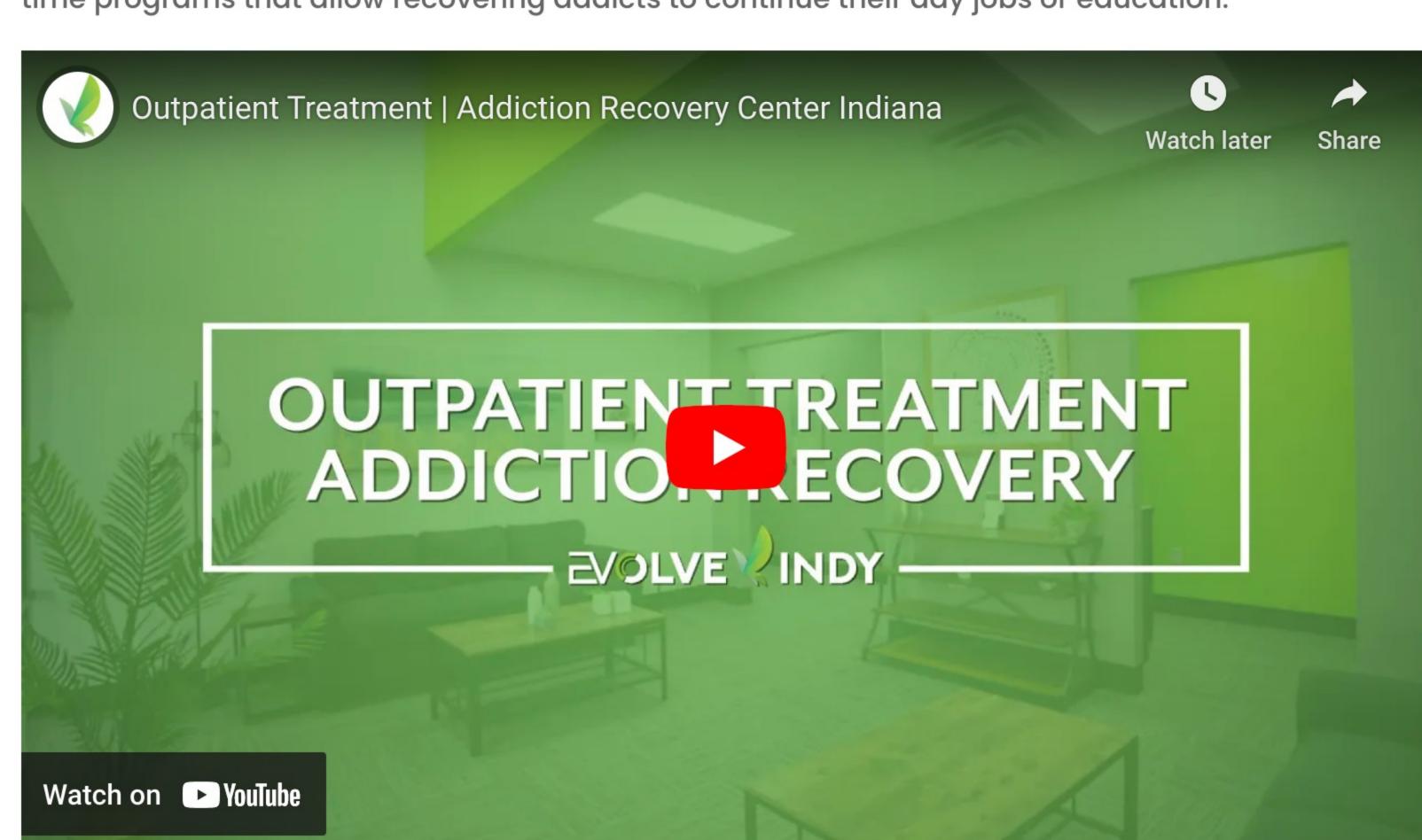
In-patient And Out-patient Addiction Treatment – What's The Difference?
